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Process

- 1 Fishing vessels along the coast of Ecuador load and conceal cocaine onto small power boats, also known as go-fast vessels (GFV).
- 2 Fishing vessels provide fuel, food, and medical services to cocaine-laden vessels as they head towards Mexico.
- 3 The cocaine is received by Mexican cartels and smuggled across the border into the United States.
